On completion of the course the students will be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- assess and explain the knowledge frontier of Oral Health Science
- identify key concepts relevant to oral health.

- value ethical standpoints and critically examine and evaluate scientific articles
- critically examine and evaluate one's own efforts and identify what needs to be improved / developed regarding the own scientific method.

Type of instruction

The course is conducted through own work in the form of a literature review in an area of Oral Health Science, chosen in consultation with the supervisor / program director.
