Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)

Upon completion of the course the student should have the

Knowledge and understanding in order to

- describe the theoretical foundations of reflection
- use current research findings to support new knowledge

Skills and ability in order to

- use a reflective journal or clinical incident report related to the clinical placement
- identify key areas for reflection in clinical practice.
- recognize and apply the value of systematic reflection in nursing practice
- critically analyze end evaluate nursing practice
- critically analyze current research findings in regards to reflection.

- value the process of reflection as a tool to enhance nursing practice

Type of instruction

Attendance requirements: Attendance is compulsory in scheduled classes and 120 hours of clinical practice.

Study methods: Individual studies, teaching sessions, written assignments, seminaries, clinical practice and field studies.

Study rate: Full time

The teaching is conducted in English.

Prerequisites

For students enrolled in School of Health Sciences` partner universities, the eligibility requirement of the respective departments apply in accordance with the above qualifications. Passing grades in courses of 30 up/credits in the main subject of Nursing depth study A, including Basic Science 7,5 up/credits or equivalent.

Examination and grades

The course is graded A, B, C, D, E, FX or F.

Exam form: Individual reflective papers and clinical evaluation.

Examiner: University lecturer serves as the course examiner.
